Enoch and Alexis had their respective pow-wows last weekend! So great to see our many young people initiated into dancing! AND our grandmothers and grandfathers honouring the spirit of dance!

THE SUMMER WENT WITH FIRES & FLOODS-MANY WERE EVACUATED TO FORT MAC- ST ALBERT AND EDMONTON...

There were more ceremonies than any other season ever.... So many were praying for those who lost everything...others were gathering resources...and betwixt and between all this is TRAUMA TRAUMA TRAUMA that is merely accelerated during these types of events

HOWEVER as you all know - that read this-we are still here...

Elder Terry Lusty spoke yesterday at the Truth and Reconciliation...one of the few around that went to residential school all his life...who never went home...he said there are hardly any of us left...my late husband...now gone 2 ½ years...in Oak River (Sioux Valley) dayschool - then residential school - then the military...born with polio...lost his hearing...breathing issues...heart issues...Manitoba-Minnesota born...tough guys...and still they BELIEVED and held ceremony

HOWEVER, there is beauty in all this \rightarrow RED ROAD summer kids camp this year was AWESOME, songs, sharing circles, visits, back to school event, hikes, space science, spray

parks, our third transformative reconciliation gathering at River Cree, with Enoch and Alexis and James Smith First Nations, our first Horse Dance and now we are in the national truth and reconciliation weekend.

I went south for many ceremonies this year...after not being able to for 25 years. We had a lot of sickness in our family; we had ceremony at home; however, we did not wander too far. Ceremonies for law, for healing, for education, for renewal. As a widow, it has been vital for me to do this; especially for my grandchildren. I lost many relatives in the last few years (as have others). It is so important that we are patient and compassionate with one another. I can only do this when I take the time myself; to remember, restore, and renew inside and outside. As our Elderlies say, there is no beginning or end; you are constantly within the flow of life. Such a beautiful thing to see folks grow, have families, have extended families...we hope to continually make a difference in urban and non-urban Indigenous...that we will embrace more of our similarities and honour one another's differences. That we will hold those values close to our hearts that bring LIFE and the renewal of LIFE...
